VETERINARY EXAMINATION FOR DYNAMIC SYNDICATIONS

At the request of Dynamic Syndications, I was asked to re-examine the **bay thoroughbred yearling filly** by **DUNDEEL (NZ)** out of **FAIROUZ (USA) 2024** to assess its continued suitability for public syndication. The purpose of the request was for the promoter to meet ongoing compliance with regulatory requirements by supplying a current veterinary certificate for inclusion with their PDS.

The filly had previously been inspected on behalf of my client Dynamic Syndications at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, Riverside Sales Complex, Warwick Farm, on the **7th February 2026**, prior to the commencement of the Sale, where a detailed pre-purchase inspection was conducted including a full set of x-rays being read and were considered **Low Risk**, and an endoscopic evaluation conducted which was **Grade 1 Lane** (normal). I advised my client in my opinion the filly was suitable for purchase.

Identification:

Near Shoulder: **JOCKEY CAP OVER 3 CONJOINED DIAMONDS**
Off Shoulder: **57 over 4**

Clinical Examination:

This examination was conducted on **2nd July 2026** at Bimbadeen Park, Werombi, NSW. The filly has previously been in pre-training and has been spelling for 18 days. This inspection was a general health check which included temperature, pulse, respiration, thoracic auscultation, as well as an ophthalmological examination for eyesight, mucous membrane colour, musculature symmetry and conformation, where no abnormalities were found.

There was no lameness at the walk and trot in hand. No response to hoof testers was found. On palpation and manipulation of the distal limbs including major joints, no abnormalities were found. The filly has a quiet temperament. Her genitalia was considered normal. No radiographs, blood tests, drug sampling, ECG or upper respiratory endoscope were performed. All clinical parameters were found to be within normal limits.

The filly remains a high-quality individual, athletic and free moving. She is well conformed and well balanced. The filly has grown significantly since her purchase however is still immature and will develop further.

Conclusion:

In my opinion as at the **2nd JULY 2026**, the date of re-examination, the **DUNDEEL (NZ) ex FAIROUZ (USA) Bay Yearling Filly**, in so far as can be determined from the examination conducted, presents in good health and has passed clinical examination and remains suitable for all risk mortality insurance cover and is suitable for racing and public syndication.

VETERINARY EXAMINATION FOR DYNAMIC SYNDICATIONS

At the request of Dynamic Syndications, a veterinary examination of the **bay** thoroughbred yearling filly by **DUNDEEL (NZ)** out of **FAIROUZ (USA) 2024** (as described Lot 1 in the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale 2026 catalogue), was performed at Inglis Riverside Complex, Warwick Farm, NSW on the 7th February 2026.

Clinical Examination:

The filly was presented in excellent clinical health, with even muscle mass and well conformed. She is a well-developed, athletic filly. Upon examination all clinical parameters were found to be within normal limits. Ophthalmic examination determined no issues of concern. Auscultation of the thorax (chest) revealed a normal and regular heart rhythm at rest, with the filly having normal lungs sounds and normal respiratory rate at rest. At the time of this examination there were no issues of concern regarding her extremities. Her genitalia was considered normal.

Repository:

The radiographic and pre scale upper airway endoscopy examinations pertaining to this horse lodged in the repository at the Inglis Riverside complex were examined and the findings were as follows:

Radiographs: Low Risk

Upper Airway Examination: Normal anatomy with Grade 1 function (Lane).

Conclusion:

In my opinion, at the time and within the limits of this examination the thoroughbred filly by **DUNDEEL (NZ)** out of **FAIROUZ (USA) 2024** in so far as can be determined within the scope of this examination, is suitable for syndication and all risk mortality insurance cover.
